- What do you think makes Elizabeth brave?
- ★ How did Elizabeth trick the dragon?
- ★ Was Ronald happy to see Elizabeth? Why or why not?
- ★ What do you think about the way Ronald talked to Elizabeth?
- ★ Do you think Elizabeth made a good choice at the end? Why?
- ★ What would you say to Elizabeth if you could talk to her?
- ★ If you could change the ending, what would happen next?
